Strategies and policy measures at National level to ensure Inclusive Mobility of disadvantaged students

Law on Higher Education of Georgia

- Legislation embedded in declarations of fundamental human rights
- Framework for safeguarding the rights of underrepresented/disadvantaged students



External quality assessment standard & criteria

- Demands HEIs to have mechanisms in place that safeguard students rights
- Ensures that regulations of student mobility are transparent, fair and in line w/ current legislation
- Requires HEIs to implement social programmes and participate in the discussion of important social issues, e.g. the inclusion of students in mobility in internationalization strategies



Initiatives to promote the mobility for disadvantaged and underrepresented students

- Some HEIs:
 - Quantitative targets in strategic development plans
 - Channels to promote mobility for disadvantaged students and underrepresented students
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 - External quality assessment standards and criteria:
 - Require HEIs to have mechanisms in place that safeguard students' rights
 - Information on this should be public, up-to-date and accessible to students and other stakeholders
