INCLUSIVE MOBILITY STRATEGY Definition of disadvantaged and underrepresented students in mobility programmes

Students w/ disabilities
Students w/ socio-economic background
Students w/ ethnic background
Roma

Geographical local/rural areas
Caring responsibilities
Other: orphans, half-orphans

Article 41: The Government shall ensure equal opportunities for disadvantaged students, those who are on unpaid leave for childcare purposes, or receive maternity benefit, childcare assistance, child-raising allowance or childcare benefit, disabled applicants, and minority applicants.

Strategies and policy measures at National level to ensure Inclusive Mobility of disadvantaged students



- No separate strategy for mobility and internationalization for higher education
- Social inclusion measures for disadvantaged students and underrepresented students are not specifically addressed
- Erasmus+ and Campus Mundi mobility programmes: additional grants for disadvantaged students



Initiatives to promote the mobility for disadvantaged and underrepresented students

- Special application for Erasmus and Campus Mundi students from disadvantaged background
- Universities' websites, with the actual application information and forms
- Information sessions where attention is paid to the calls for application for additional funds
- **Exchangeability project**: help students w/ disabilities in mobility experiences
- Facebook and Instagram campaigns in the application period

Posts can be reposted by the HEIs

Specific public support services and/or public grants for disadvantaged students



- Erasmus+ & the Campus Mundi mobility programmes: additional grants for disadvantaged students and students with disabilities
- Incoming mobility: National Agency wants to offer 100 €/month for incoming & outgoing students w/ disadvantaged background
- National criteria determine whether students can be considered of disadvantaged background

BARRIERS CURRENTLY FACED

- Financial obstacles (students from low-income families; tuition free; expenses of mobility period)
 - Lack of knowledge of foreign languages
- Working students
- Lack of motivation or good example: students from families with poor social background
- Psychological obstacles: fear of the mobility period and leaving the family/country behind

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GOOD PRACTICE

All HEIs should have a coordinator dealing with the problems of students with disabilities or special needs (so called "coordinator of equal opportunities"). Students' Unions existing at all HEIs usually have a special committee dealing with social issues, helping relevant students.

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
