

1. Description?

- Via **Google Maps**, Google's **online mapping service**, you'll find the best **route** for travel by car, public transport, bike and foot. Google Maps also shows **wheelchair-friendly routes** and provides information about wheelchair accessibility of locations. The option is currently available in a limited number of cities, but more locations are added gradually.

2. For whom and why?

- Google Maps is useful for everyone, the functionality for wheelchair-friendly routes offers added value for students in wheelchairs.

3. How does it work?

- To map out (wheelchair-friendly) routes, follow these steps:
 - Find a destination through the search bar at the top of the screen;
 - Click the 'Route' button and fill in a starting point or keep 'My location' filled in;
 - Choose the mode of transport you want by clicking on the appropriate icon;
- For wheelchair-friendly routes:
 - Click on the three dots at the top right of the screen;
 - Click "Route Options";
 - Click 'Wheelchair accessible'.

4. Pricing

- Google Maps is **free** to download and use.

5. Language

- Google Maps is available in multiple languages, including English.

6. Type and platform

- Google Maps is an **application** and a **website**. Google Maps is available as an app for **smartphones** and **tablets** running on **Android** and **iOS** and through the website.
