

## 1. Description?

- Sonix automatically converts audio and video into text. Through speech-to-text algorithms, Sonix quickly converts audio into an accurate transcript that can be easily shared and edited. Sonix's in-browser editor allows users to search, play, edit, organize and share transcripts anywhere on any device.

## 2. For whom and why?

- The program can be an aid for individuals with hearing impairments but is also useful for other students and counselors. Persons with auditory disabilities often have difficulty following spoken audio or video. Sonix automatically generates subtitles or transcripts, making audio and video accessible. Because the software can generate subtitles and transcripts quickly, even individuals with auditory impairments can follow the content without limitations.

## 3. How does it work?

- Convert** | Sonix converts an audio or video file to an easy-to-edit transcript.
- Modify** | The 'AudioText Editor' attaches audio to text. This allows users to edit audio and text simultaneously. It is possible to insert, delete and modify words and word groups. You can search, play, edit, organize and share your transcripts via the in-browser editor anywhere on any device.
- Collaborate** | With extended multi-user permissions, you can give collaborators access to upload, edit and limit access to files or folders.

## 4. Pricing

- With the free trial plan, you get 30 minutes of audio for free. After that, you need a subscription. The standard subscription is a pay-to-use subscription for

one user. You buy transcription hours in advance and use them as you need them.

## 5. Language

- Sonix transcribes into more than 35 languages, including English.

## 6. Type and platform

- Sonix is a software program, available for laptop/computer (Windows and Mac), and for smartphones/tablets running Android and iOS. Sonix is also available through the website.
