

1. Description?

- TalkBack is **Google's screen reader**, available for **Android devices**. TalkBack provides voice feedback so the user **can use the device without having to look at the screen**. Among other things, you can navigate the device, use a Braille keyboard, browse the web, answer and end calls, etc.

2. For whom and why?

- TalkBack is especially interesting for students with **visual impairments**. The TalkBack feature makes it possible to control the device with gestures without seeing the screen and to type through the Braille keyboard.

3. How does it work?

- Turn on TalkBack
 - Buttons** | Hold down both volume buttons for three seconds.
 - Settings** | Open settings > accessibility > TalkBack > Turn on.
- Use TalkBack
 - Gestures** | TalkBack makes it possible to perform different actions on the device using gestures on the screen such as swiping left to reject an incoming call.
 - Personalisable** | It is possible to choose the gestures yourself.
 - Braille keyboard** | Check out the "Talkback: Braille Keyboard" fiche.
